




Euphyia intermediata Sharp-angled Carpet

DISTRIBUTION: Restricted to the mountains in North Carolina, it is found at both higher and lower elevations, and can be locally abundant.

FLIGHT COMMENT: Please refer to the flight charts.

HABITAT: Our records come almost entirely from montane riparian forests and cove forests.

FOOD: Forbes (1948) lists chickweed (*Stellaria* sp.) and other Caryophyllaceae as host plants. Covell (1984) additionally lists elm (*Ulmus*), *Impatiens*, and mustard (*Brassica* sp.). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
