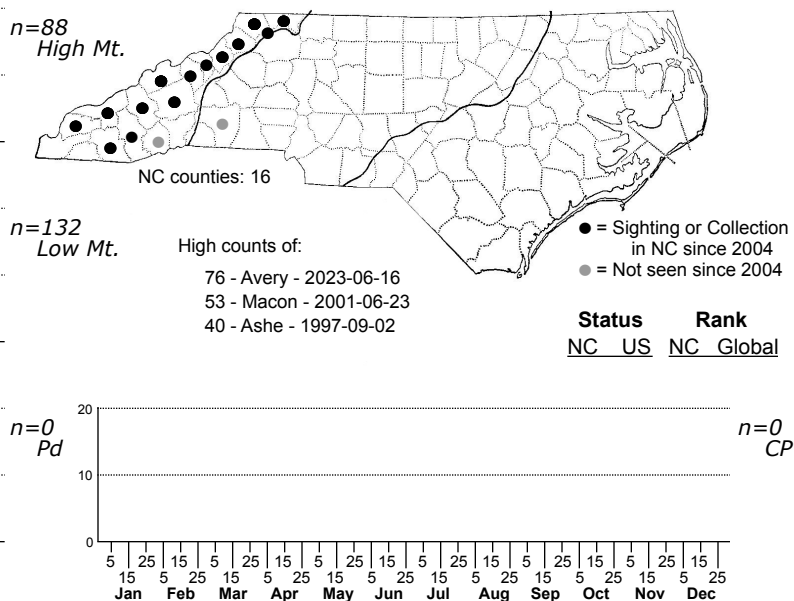
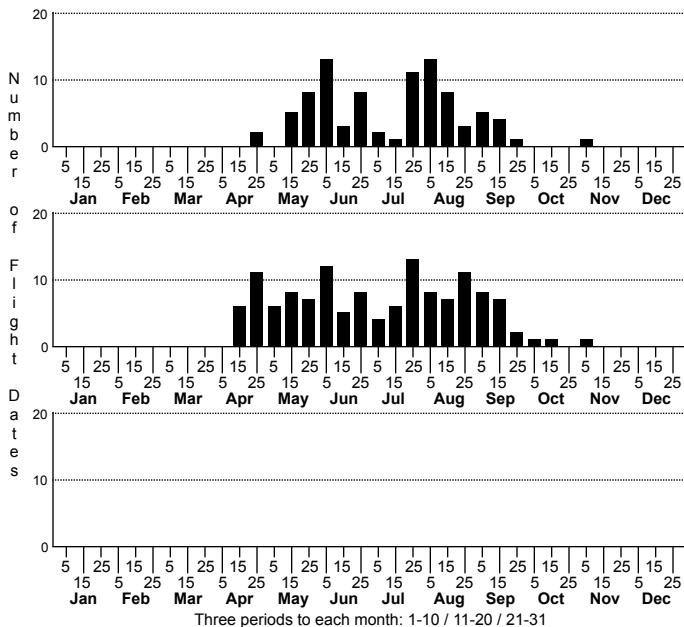


*Euphyia intermediata* Sharp-angled Carpet Moth

ID COMMENTS:

DISTRIBUTION: Restricted to the mountains in North Carolina, it is found at both higher and lower elevations, and can be locally abundant.

FLIGHT COMMENT: Please refer to the flight charts.

HABITAT: Our records come almost entirely from montane riparian forests and cove forests

FOOD: Forbes (1948) lists Chickweed (*Stellaria* species) and other Caryophyllaceae as host plants. Covell (1984) additionally lists Elm, Impatiens, and Mustard.
