




Eupithecia subfuscata Gray Pug Moth

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae are apparently highly polyphagous, with reported hosts including fir (*Abies*), alder (*Alnus*), Sweetfern (*Comptonia peregrina*), willowherb (*Epilobium*), st. john's-wort (*Hypericum*), larch (*Larix*), apple (*Malus*), willow (*Salix*), and goldenrod (*Solidago*) (Robinson et al., 2010).
