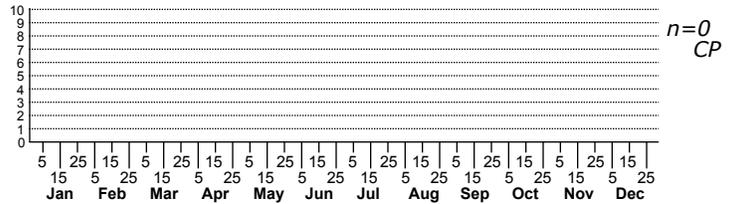



ID COMMENTS: The forewings are elongated, with a pointed apex (Rindge, 1985). The ground color is almost unicolorous gray, with the maculation faintly represented. A discal dot is present and a partial postmedian line or band. The hindwings are paler than the forewings, but darkened along the anal margin; the maculation is usually absent, although a small discal dot may be present in some specimens.
