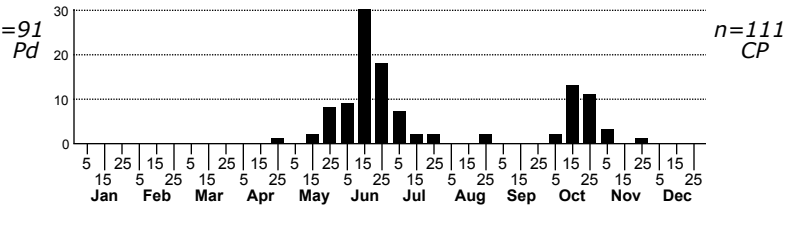
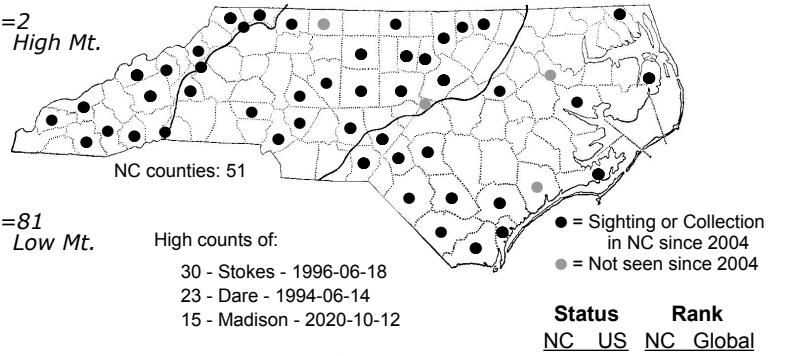
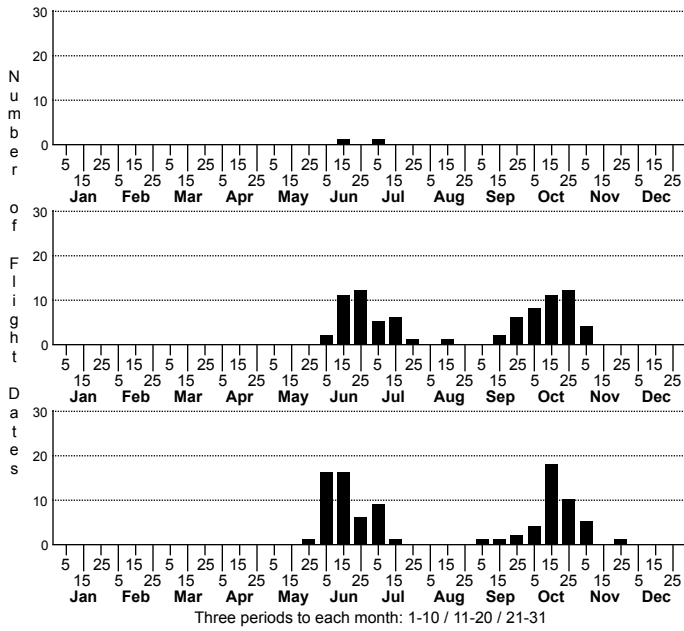


Artace cribrarius Dot-lined White

HABITAT: Fields, woodlands, and forest edges (Wagner, 2005). North Carolina records come from most wooded habitats, from maritime forests, peatlands, bottomlands, Longleaf Pine habitats, mesic forests, cove forests, and dry ridges.

FOOD: Larvae are polyphagous, feeding on cherry, rose, oak, and probably other species of hardwood trees and shrubs (Wagner, 2005). In North Carolina, we have found larvae feeding on ash, cherry, and Cherrybark Oak (<i>Quercus pagoda</i>).
