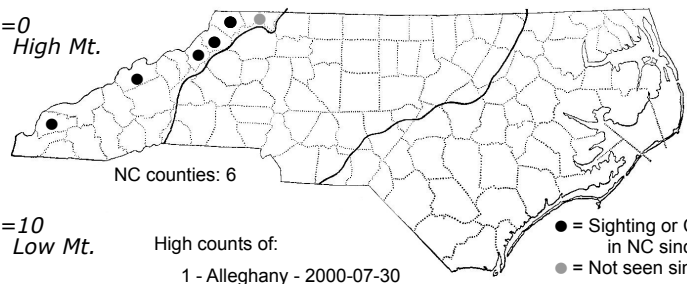
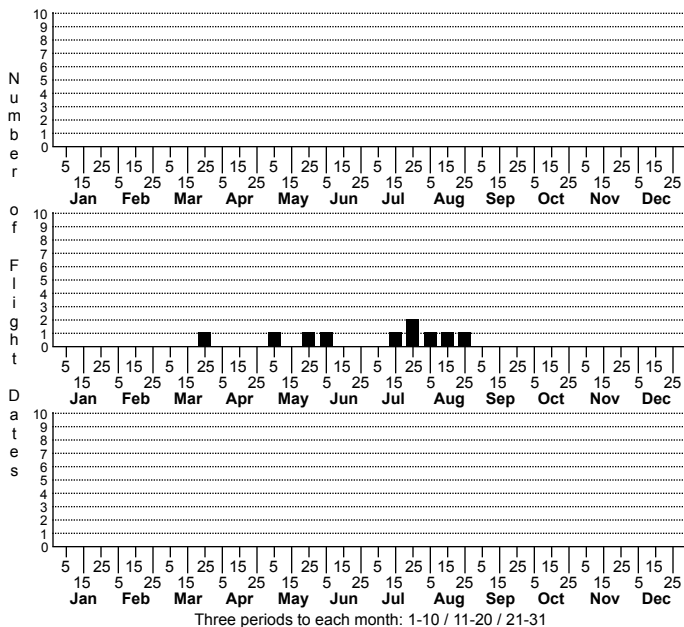


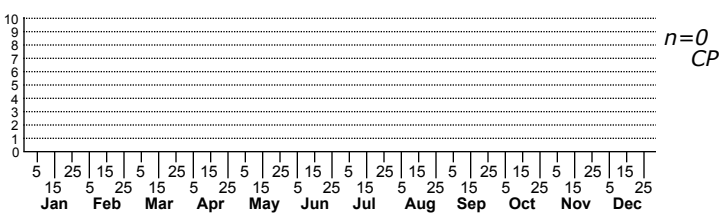
Clostera apicalis Apical Prominent
