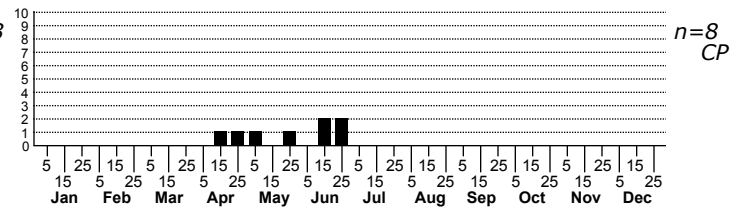
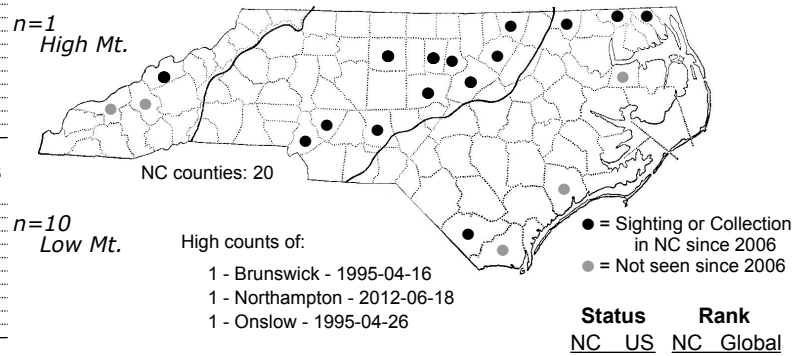
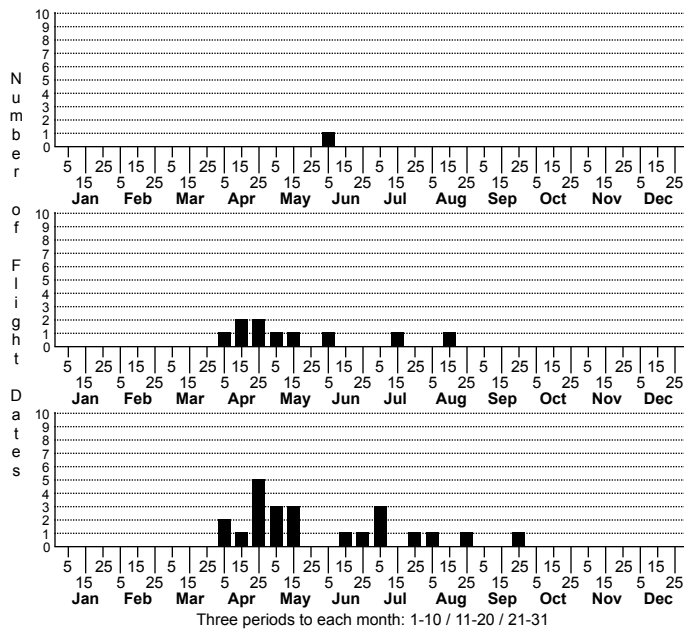


# *Nerice bidentata* Double-toothed Prominent

HABITAT: Our records come almost entirely from bottomland hardwoods, particularly with rich alluvial soils.

FOOD: Larvae feed on elms, probably primarily on large-leaved species, including American Elm (*Ulmus americana*) and Slippery Elm (*U. rubra*) (Wagner, 2005). In North Carolina, we have feeding records for American Elm and Winged Elm (*U. alata*).
