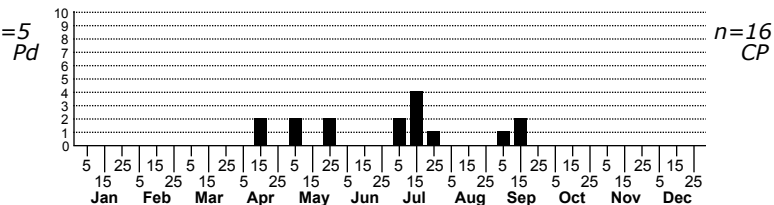
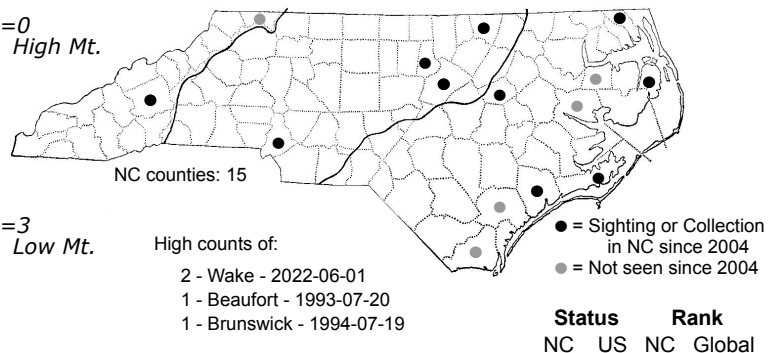
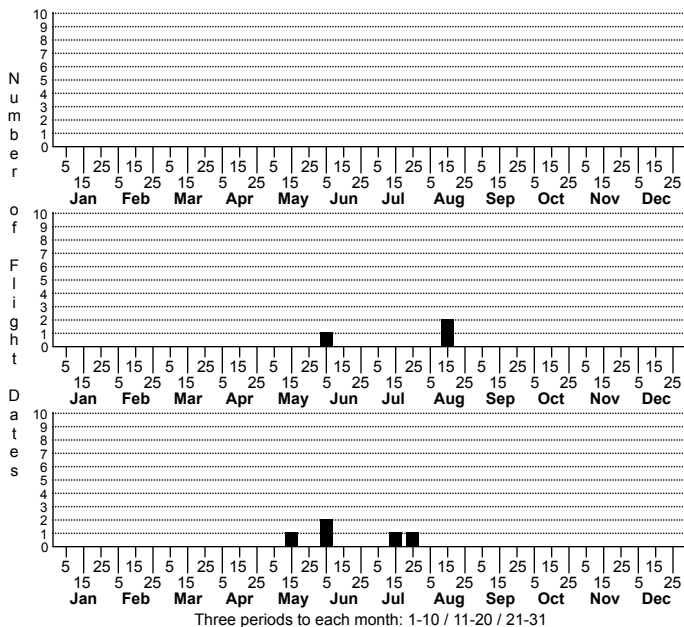

HABITAT: Almost all of our records come from sites where willows are present but not poplars, including a large number from barrier islands.

FOOD: Larvae feed on Poplars and Willow (Wagner, 2005). In North Carolina, we have observed the species feeding on Black Willow (*Salix nigra*).
