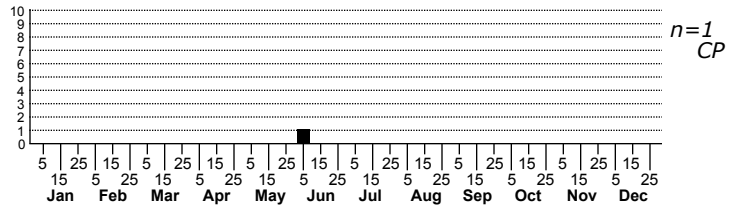
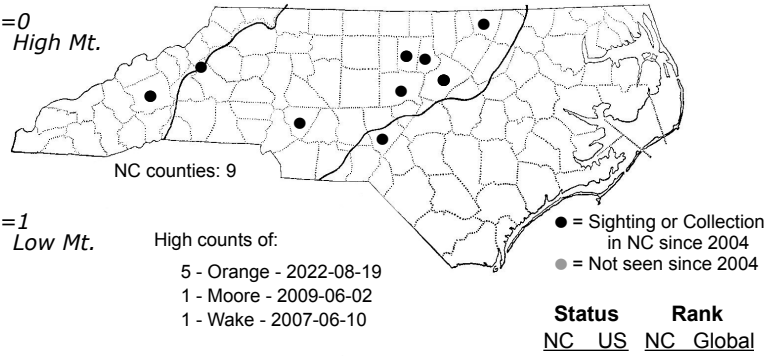
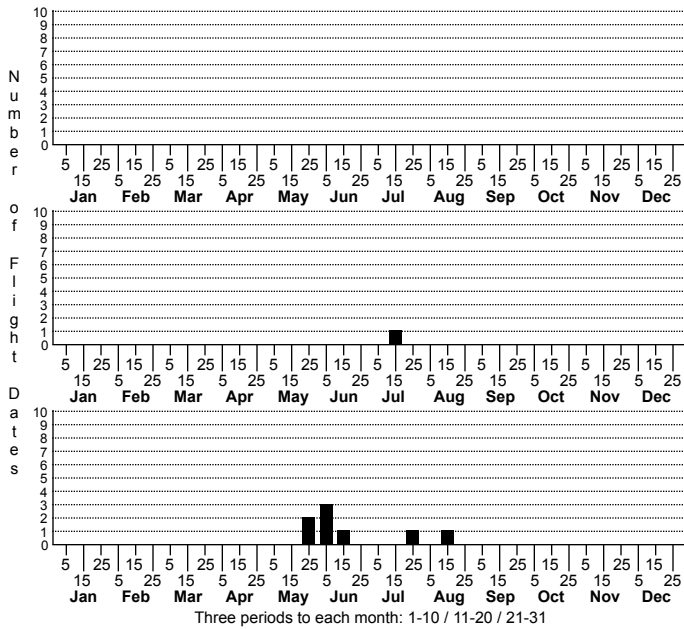


Americerura scitiscrupta Black-etched Prominent

HABITAT: Our records come from both lake and river shorelines.

FOOD: Larvae feed on willows and poplars (Wagner, 2005). In the Southeast, willows are the primary hosts, particularly Black Willow (*Salix nigra*) and Coastal Plain Willow (*Salix caroliniana*) (Miller et al., 2018). We have records of larvae feeding on both of these willow species in North Carolina.
