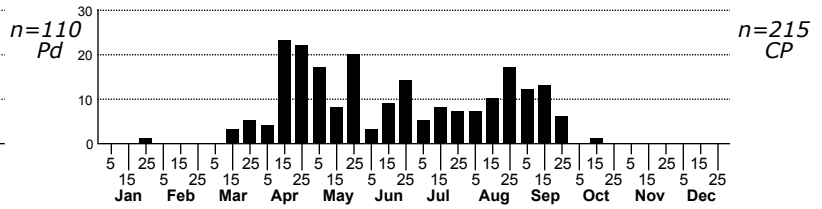
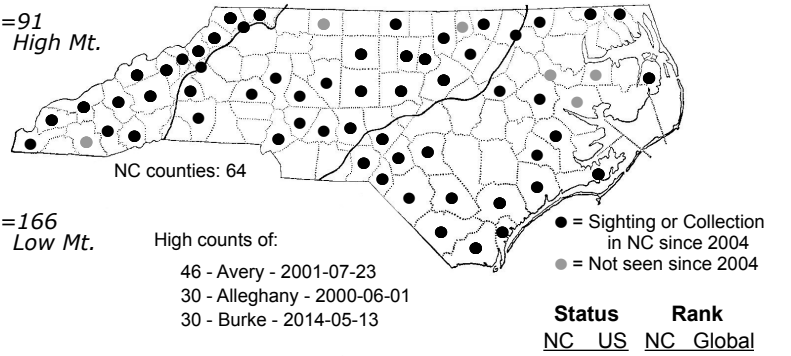
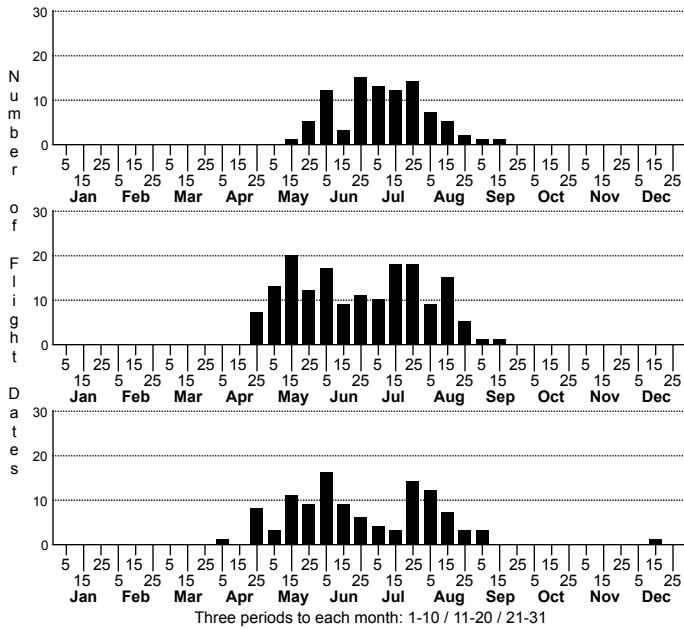


*Cecrita biundata* Wavy-Lined Prominent

DISTRIBUTION: Occurs statewide

FLIGHT COMMENT: Please refer to the flight charts.

HABITAT: Woodlands and forests (Wagner, 2005). Our records come from a wide range of hardwood forests and shrublands across the state.

FOOD: Polyphagous, feeding on a wide range of hardwood trees and shrubs (Wagner, 2005). As of 2023, we have observed it feeding on maple, birch, dogwood, persimmon, beech, wax-myrtle, and sourwood in North Carolina.
