
Cecrita biundata Wavy-lined Prominent

DISTRIBUTION: Occurs statewide

HABITAT: Woodlands and forests (Wagner, 2005). Our records come from a wide range of hardwood forests and shrublands across the state.

FOOD: Larvae are polyphagous, feeding on a wide range of hardwood trees and shrubs (Wagner, 2005). In North Carolina, we have observed it feeding on Florida Maple (<i>Acer floridanum</i>), Box-elder (<i>A. negundo</i>), Red Maple (<i>A. rubrum</i>), Flowering Dogwood (<i>Benthamidia florida</i>), River Birch (<i>Betula nigra</i>), American Persimmon (<i>Diospyros virginiana</i>), American Beech (<i>Fagus grandifolia</i>), Common Waxmyrtle (<i>Morella cerifera</i>), Sourwood (<i>Oxydendrum arboreum</i>), and Stiff Dogwood (<i>Swida foemina</i>).
