



HABITAT: Barrens, woodlands, and forests (Wagner, 2005).

FOOD: Larvae are polyphagous, feeding on many hardwood trees and shrubs but with hickory and walnut preferred (Wagner, 2005). In North Carolina, larvae have been recorded feeding on Black Walnut (*Juglans nigra*), Pecan (*Carya illinoensis*), and other hickories.
