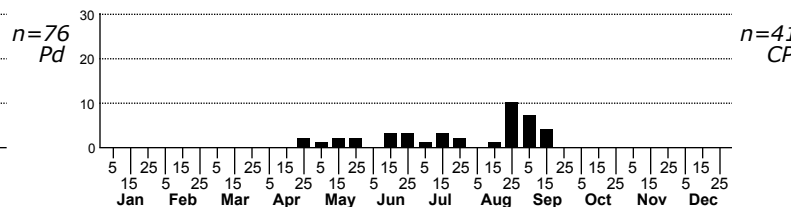
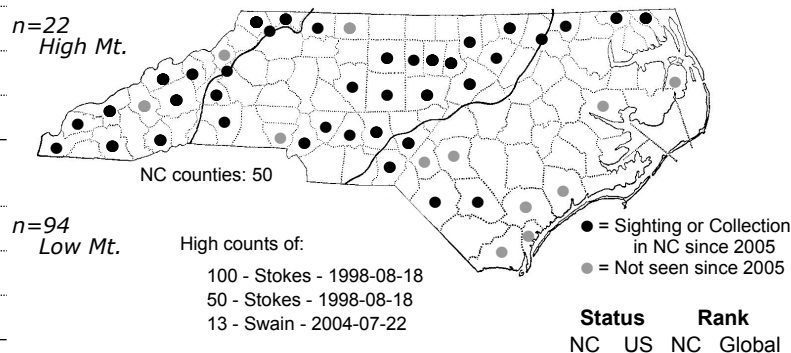
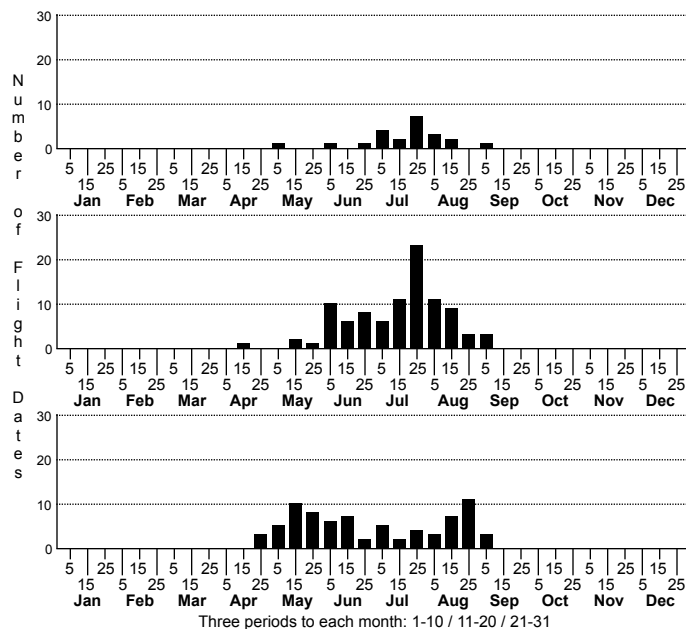


Ianassa lignicolor White-streaked Prominent

HABITAT: Barrens, woodlands, and forests (Wagner, 2005). Our records span the range of hardwood forests in North Carolina, from maritime forests to northern hardwoods.

FOOD: Larvae feed on members of the Fagaceae, including beech, chestnut, and oaks, but also reported on birch (Wagner 2005). In North Carolina, larvae have been recorded on White Oak (*Quercus alba*) and Cherrybark Oak (*Q. pagoda*).
