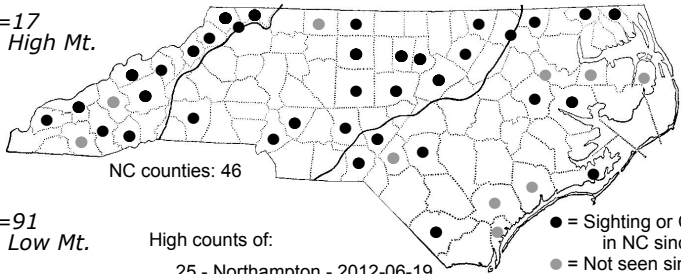
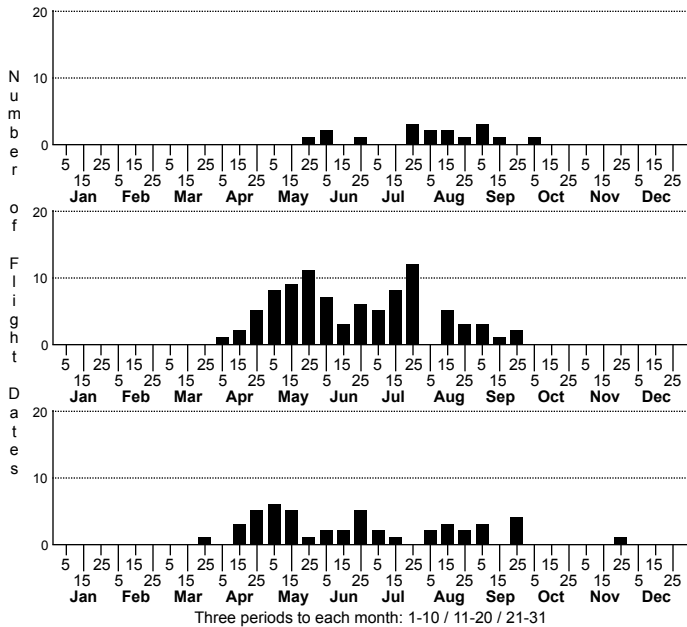


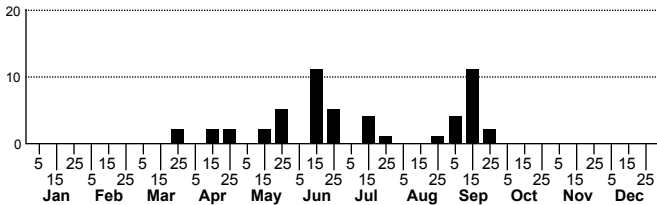
# Phalaenophana pyramusalis Dark-banded Owlet Moth
