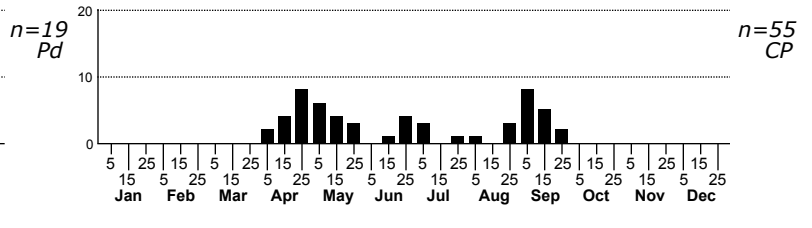
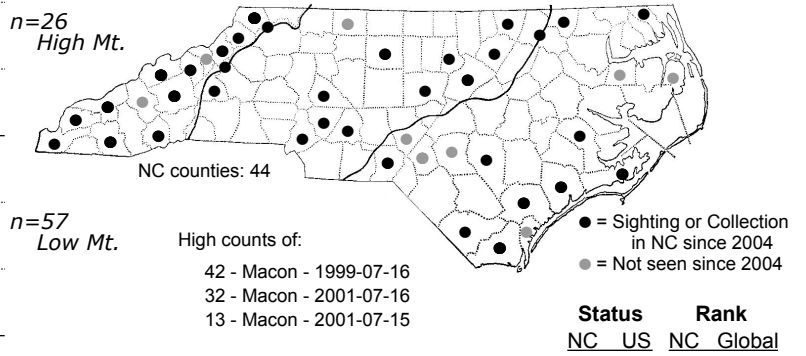
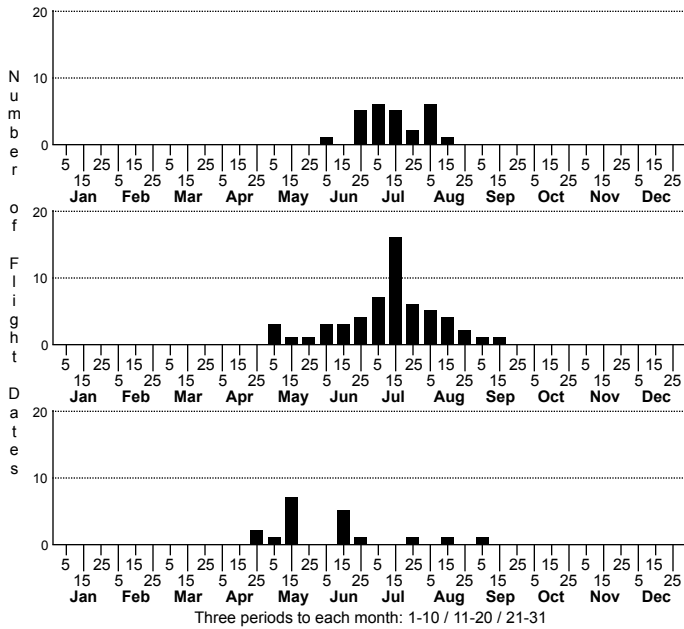


Zanclognatha lituralis Lettered Zanclognatha Moth
