
## Zanclognatha theralis Flagged Zanclognatha

HABITAT: Our records come primarily from forested sites, but including both pine and hardwood dominated stands. Few, if any, come from open habitats, including savannas, maritime grasslands, and old fields.

FOOD: Larvae have been reared from Old Man's Beard (<i>Usnea</i>) (Sigal, cited by Wagner et al., 2011), but other members of this genus typically feed on dead leaves.
