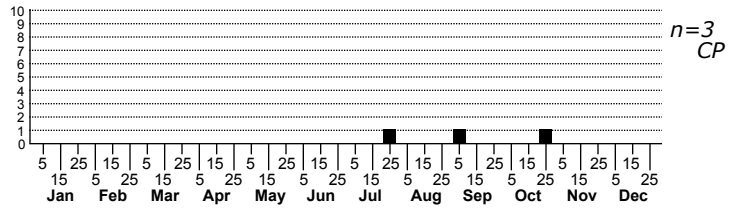
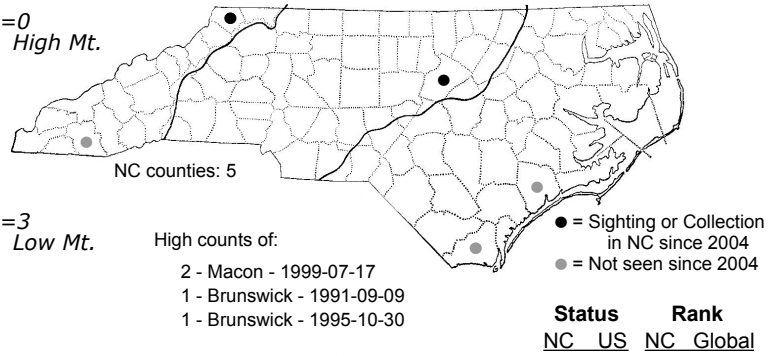
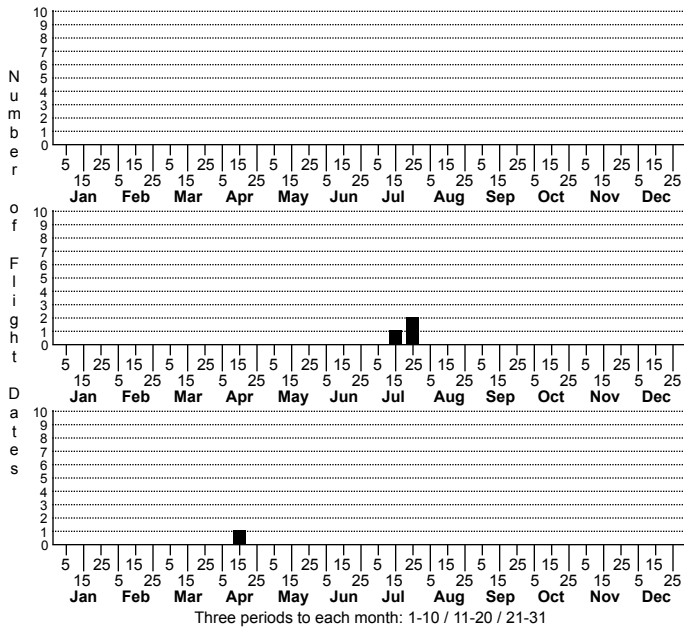


Hyphenula cacuminalis Long-Horned Owlet Moth

HABITAT: Most of our records come from open, wet-mesic habitats, including savannas, lakes and pond shores, and river floodplains. One record comes from a ridge in the mountains.

FOOD: Larvae presumably feed on dead organic matter but also fed on freshly picked pokeweed (Wagner et al., 2011)
