

ID COMMENTS: The ground color is a dark, smoky gray with little or no contrasts (Forbes, 1954). The antemedian and postmedian are inconspicuous but darker than the ground color and either dentate or irregular. In our specimens, the subterminal often consists of narrow white dots. The orbicular and reniform are yellowish or orange; the reniform can have large, dark central spots that sometimes forms a connected lunule.

HABITAT: The majority of our records come from Longleaf Pine savannas, seeps, bog, shorelines, and other open, wet, herbdominated habitats

FOOD: Feeding preferences are not well documented but larvae are believed to feed on dead leaves and other detritus (Wagner et al., 2011).
