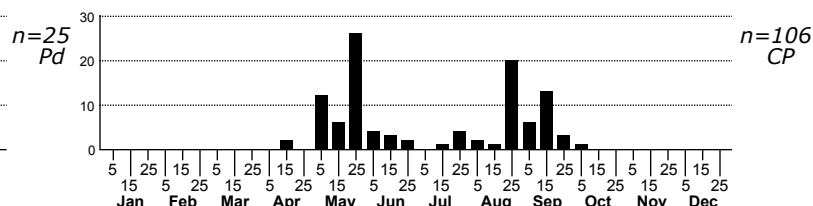
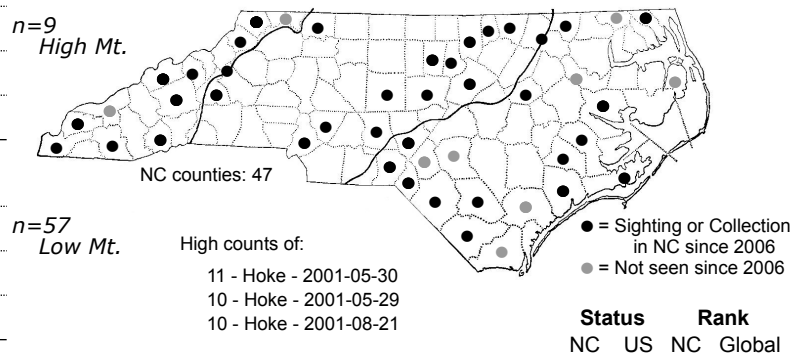
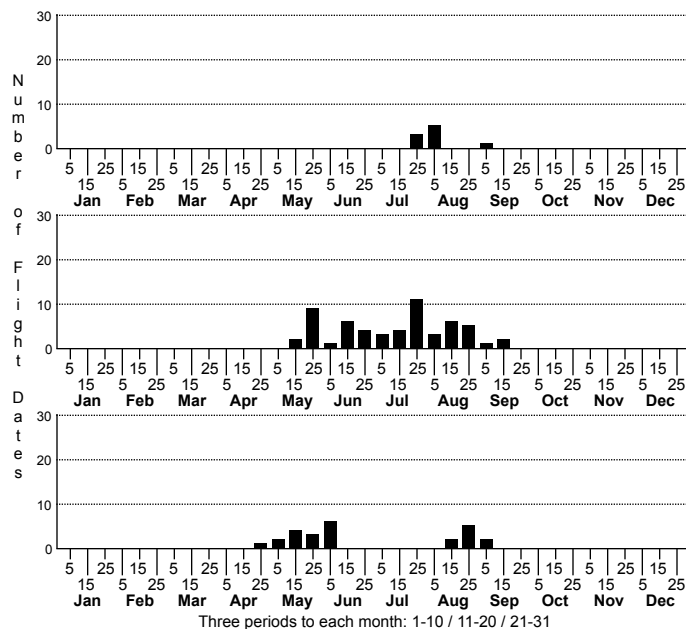


Nigetia formosalis Thin-winged Owlet Moth

DISTRIBUTION: Occurs essentially statewide in North Carolina.

HABITAT: Our records come almost entirely from hardwood forests, but covering the range from maritime forests to swamps and bottomlands to northern hardwoods at elevations above 4,000 feet. The majority come from wet to mesic sites but there are also some from sandridges and dry ridges.

FOOD: Larvae have been reared on tree algae and probably also feed on lichens (T., McCabe, cited by Wagner et al., 2011).
