
Hypena baltimoralis Baltimore Snout

DISTRIBUTION: Occurs statewide

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae feed on maples, including Red Maple (<i>Acer rubrum</i>) and Silver Maple (<i>A. saccharinum</i>) (Wagner et al., 2011). Our only feeding record in North Carolina is for Florida Maple (<i>A. floridanum</i>), but other maples are likely also used throughout the state.
