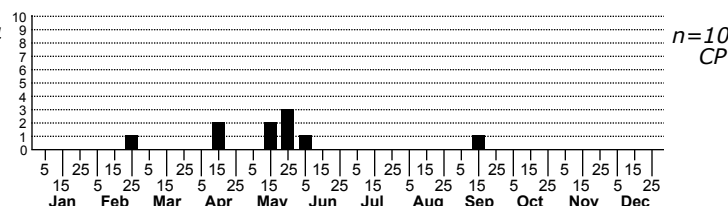
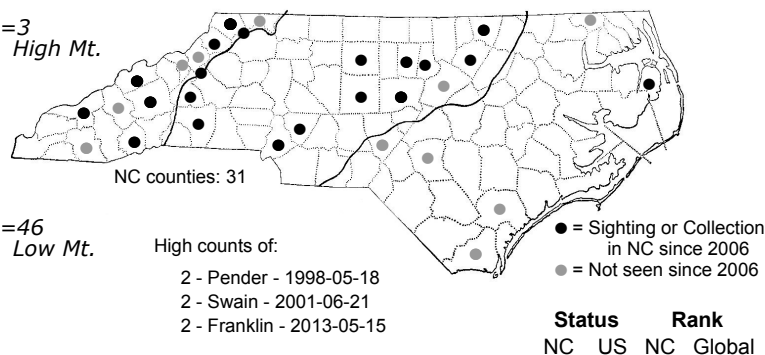
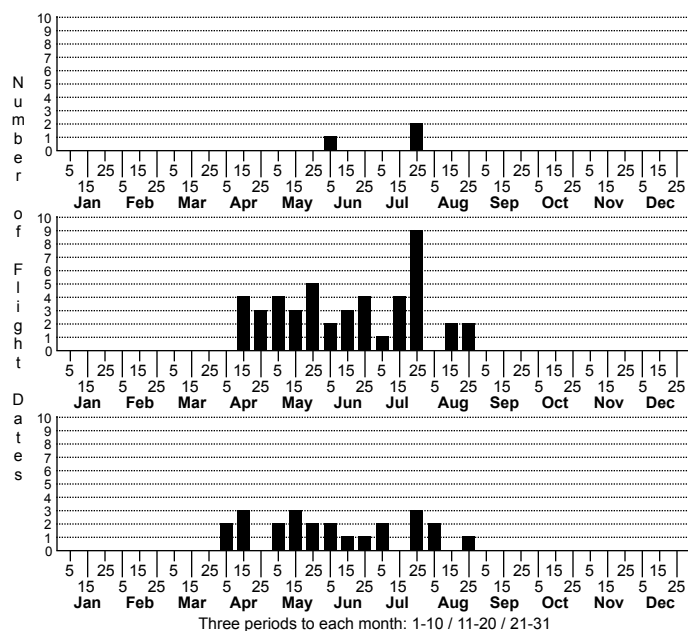


Hypena bijugalis Dimorphic Snout



FAMILY: Erebidae SUBFAMILY: Hypeninae TRIBE:

TAXONOMIC COMMENTS: One of 29 species in this genus that occur in North America north of Mexico (Lafontaine and Schmidt, 2010). Fifteen species have been recorded in North Carolina.

ID COMMENTS:

DISTRIBUTION: Found nearly statewide in North Carolina, but uncommon in the Coastal Plain.

FLIGHT COMMENT: Please refer to the flight charts.

HABITAT: Our records for this species come mainly from wet-mesic hardwood forests, from the Outer Banks to the high mountains.

FOOD: Larvae feed on dogwoods, especially shrubby species (Wagner et al., 2011).

STATE PROTECTION: Has no legal protection, although permits are required to collect it on state parks and other public lands.
