
Hypena palparia Mottled Snout

TAXONOMIC_COMMENTS: One of 29 species in this genus that occur in North America north of Mexico (Lafontaine and Schmidt, 2010). Fifteen species have been recorded in North Carolina.

DISTRIBUTION: Occurs nearly statewide in North Carolina, but is uncommon in the Coastal Plain.

HABITAT: Our records come primarily from rich, wet-mesic stands of hardwoods.

FOOD: Larvae feed on American Hornbeam (<i>Carpinus caroliniana</i>), American Hop-hornbeam (<i>Ostrya virginiana</i>), and hazels (<i>Corylus</i>) (Wagner et al., 2011).
