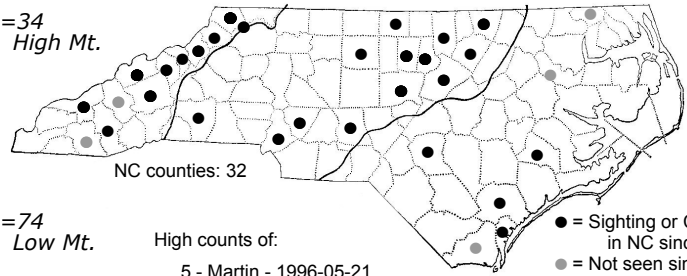
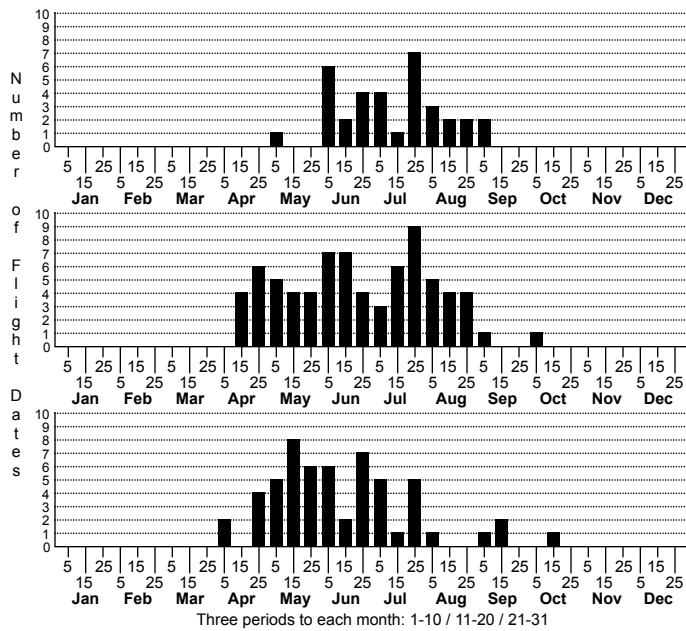


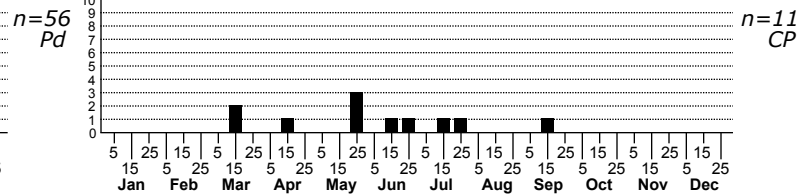
Hypena palparia Mottled Snout

TAXONOMIC_COMMENTS: One of 29 species in this genus that occur in North America north of Mexico (Lafontaine and Schmidt, 2010). Fifteen species have been recorded in North Carolina.

DISTRIBUTION: Occurs nearly statewide in North Carolina, but is uncommon in the Coastal Plain.

FLIGHT COMMENT: Please refer to the flight charts.

HABITAT: Our records come primarily from rich, wet-mesic stands of hardwoods.

FOOD: Larvae feed on American Hornbeam (*Carpinus caroliniana*), American Hop-hornbeam (*Ostrya virginiana*), and hazels (*Corylus*) (Wagner et al., 2011).
