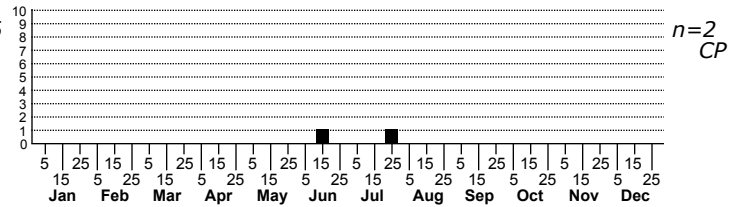
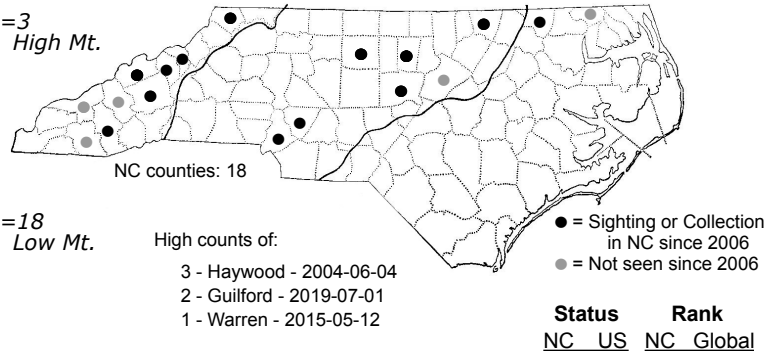
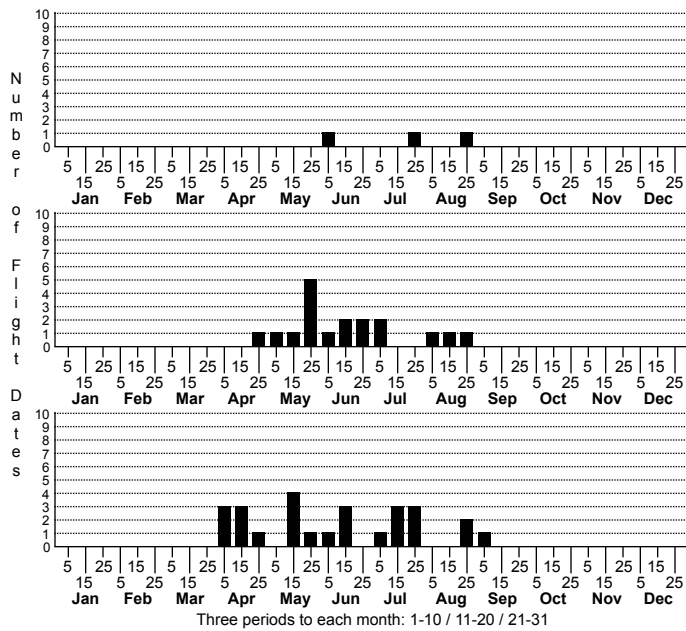


Hypena abalienalis White-lined Snout



FAMILY: Erebidae SUBFAMILY: Hypeninae TRIBE:

TAXONOMIC COMMENTS: One of 29 species in this genus that occur in North America north of Mexico (Lafontaine and Schmidt, 2010). Fifteen species have been recorded in North Carolina.

HABITAT: Our records come from brownwater river floodplains, cove forests, and other stand of rich, wet-mesic hardwood forests

FOOD: Larvae feed on elms, particularly American Elm (*Ulmus americana*) and Slippery Elm (*U. rubra*) (Wagner et al., 2011). In North Carolina, our only feeding record is for American Elm.
