
Hypena sordidula Sordid Snout

TAXONOMIC_COMMENTS: One of 29 species in this genus that occur in North America north of Mexico (Lafontaine and Schmidt, 2010). Fifteen species have been recorded in North Carolina.

ID COMMENTS:

DISTRIBUTION: Found primarily in the Mountains in North Carolina, with only a few records from the Piedmont.

FLIGHT COMMENT: Please refer to the flight charts.

HABITAT: North Carolina records come mainly from cove forests and alluvial forests in the Mountains; it also occupies at least a few rich alluvial forests in the Piedmont and possibly the Coastal Plain.

FOOD: Larvae feed on Wood-nettle (<i>Laportea</i>), with reports from Butternut (<i>Juglans cinerea</i>) and alder (<i>Alnus</i>) apparently in error (Wagner et al., 2011).
