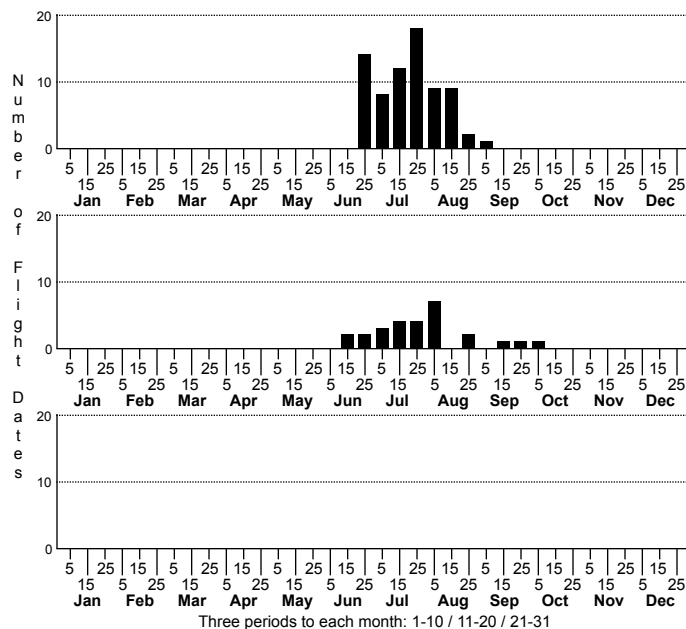


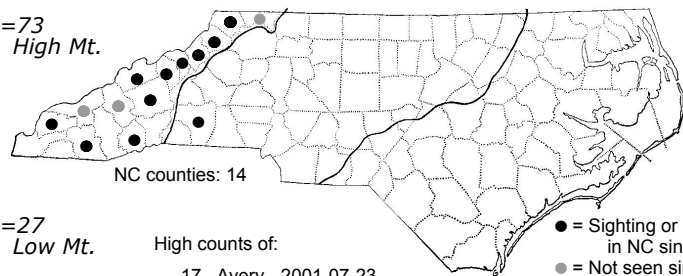
Hypena edictalis Large Snout

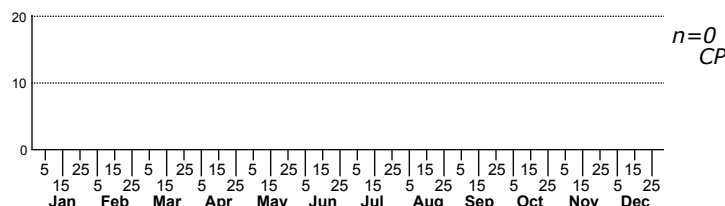

TAXONOMIC_COMMENTS: One of 29 species in this genus that occur in North America north of Mexico (Lafontaine and Schmidt, 2010). Fifteen species have been recorded in North Carolina.

ID COMMENTS:

DISTRIBUTION: The species has not been recorded outside the Mountains in North Carolina.

HABITAT: Our records come almost entirely from high elevation hardwoods and cove forests.

FOOD: Larvae reportedly feed on wood-nettle (*Laportea*) and possibly Stinging Nettle (*Urtica*) (Wagner et al., 2011).
