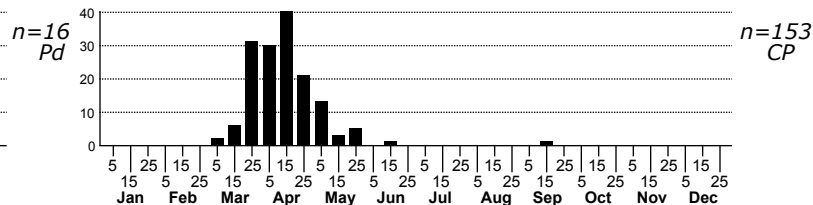
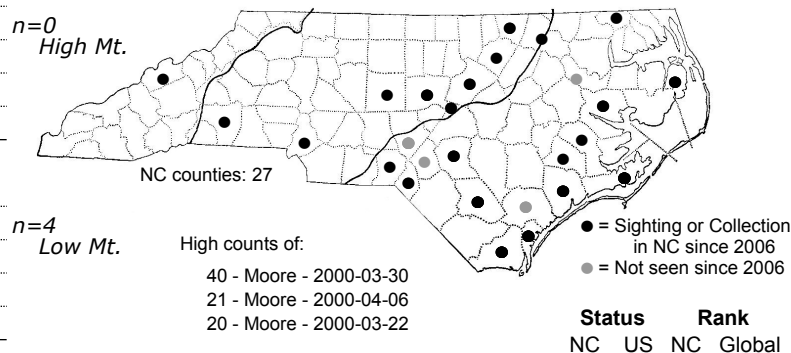
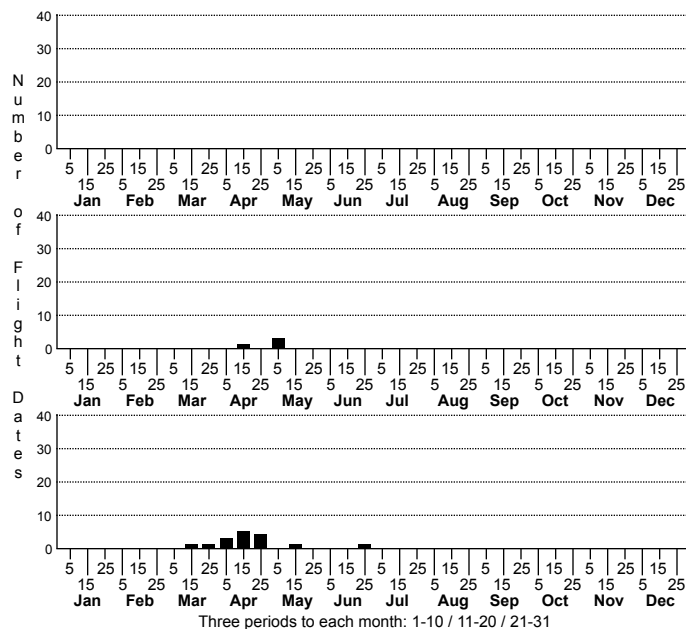


Hypsoropha monilis Large Necklace Moth

DISTRIBUTION: Mainly found in the Coastal Plain in North Carolina; uncommon in the Piedmont and rare in the Mountains.

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae feed on American Persimmon (*Diospyros virginiana*), with reports from oak probably in error (Wagner et al., 2011). In North Carolina, larvae have been recorded on persimmon.
