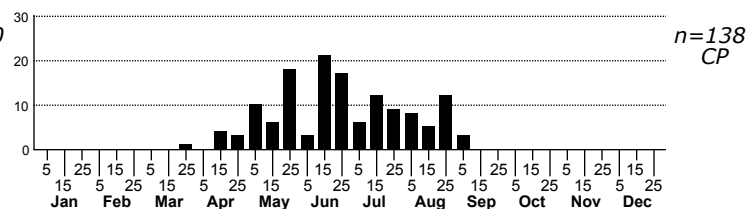
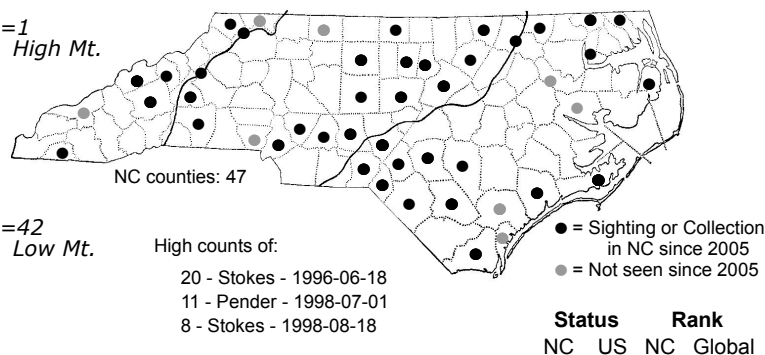
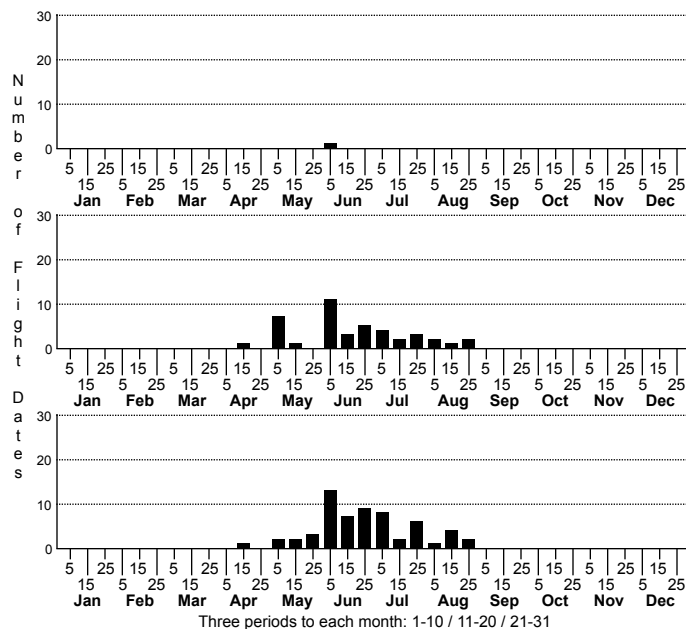


Hypsoropha hormos Small Necklace Moth

DISTRIBUTION: Essentially found statewide in North Carolina, but rare at higher elevations in the Mountains.

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae feed on American Persimmon (*Diospyros virginiana*), with reports from Sassafras probably in error (Wagner et al., 2011). In North Carolina, larvae have been recorded on persimmon.
