




Panopoda rufimargo Red-lined Panopoda

DISTRIBUTION: Occurs statewide in North Carolina.

HABITAT: Wagner et al. (2011) list barrens, woodlands and forest as habitat.

FOOD: Larvae feed on beech and oak (Wagner et al., 2011); reports from other hosts require confirmation. In North Carolina, larvae have been recorded feeding on Darlington Oak (<i>Quercus hemisphaerica</i>), Willow Oak (<i>Q. phellos</i>), and Post Oak (<i>Q. stellata</i>).
