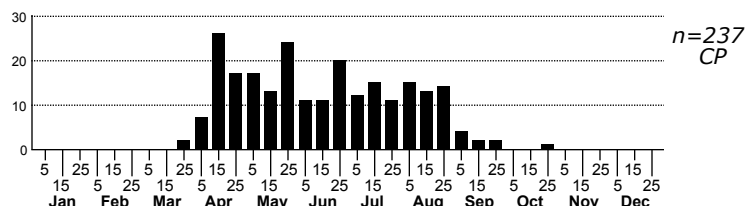
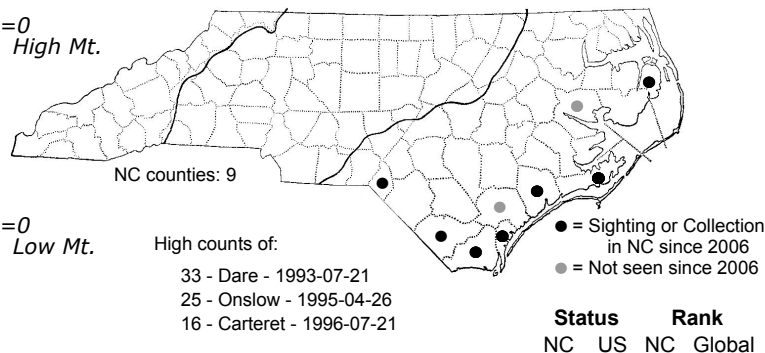
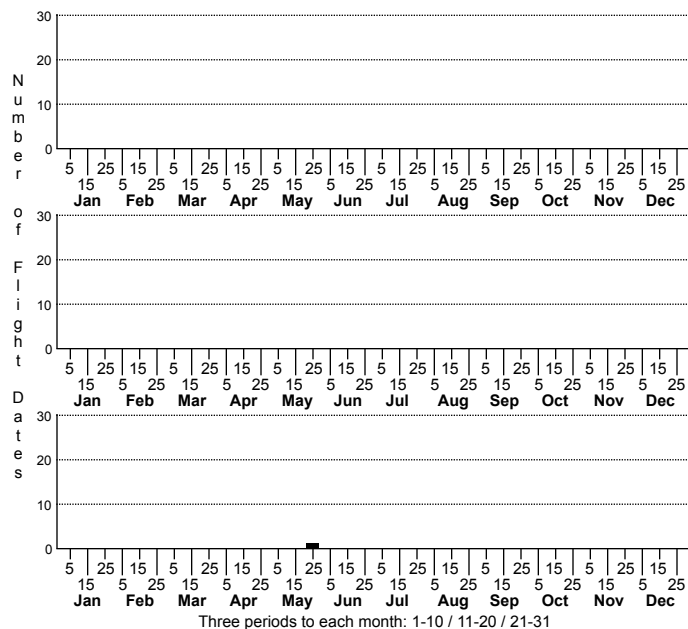


Panopoda repanda Orange Panopoda

DISTRIBUTION: Restricted to the Coastal Plain in North Carolina.

HABITAT: The majority of our records come from barrier islands, with another large group coming from Coastal Fringe Sandhill communities on the adjoining portions of the mainland. We also have a record from xeric sandridge habitat along the Lumber River in Columbus County. Live Oak is present to common in all of these areas.

FOOD: Larvae feed on Live Oak (*Quercus virginiana*) (Wagner et al., 2011), which has been confirmed as the host species in North Carolina.
