
## Cissusa spadix Black-dotted Brown Moth

## ID COMMENTS:

DISTRIBUTION: Occurs statewide in North Carolina.

FLIGHT COMMENT: Please refer to the flight charts.

HABITAT: Our records come from a wide range of wet, mesic, and dry forests, from the barrier islands to high mountains.

FOOD: Larvae feed mainly on oaks, including Northern Red Oak (<i>Quercus rubra</i>), White Oak (<i>Q. alba</i>), and Live Oak (<i>Q. virginiana</i>); may also feed on hickories (<i>Carya</i>) and other species during outbreaks (Wagner et al., 2011). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
