




Euparthenos nubilis Locust Underwing

DISTRIBUTION: Found primarily in the mountains in North Carolina, but also with scattered records from the Piedmont.

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae feed primarily on Black Locust (<i>Robinia pseudoacacia</i>) but may also feed on other species of locust (Wagner et al., 2011). In North Carolina, Black Locust is the only confirmed host.
