

DISTRIBUTION: Found statewide in North Carolina.

FLIGHT COMMENT: Please refer to the flight charts.

HABITAT: Found across the range of <i>Nyssa</i> species, including swamp forests and blackwater riparian forests in the Coastal Plain and dry ridges in the Piedmont and Mountains.

FOOD: Larvae feed on tupelo (<i>Nyssa</i>) species (Wagner et al., 2011). Covell (1984) also lists hickory (<i>Carya</i>) and walnut (<i>Juglans</i>). David George has documented a larva believed to be this species feeding on Blackgum (<i>Nyssa sylvatica</i>) in Durham County.
