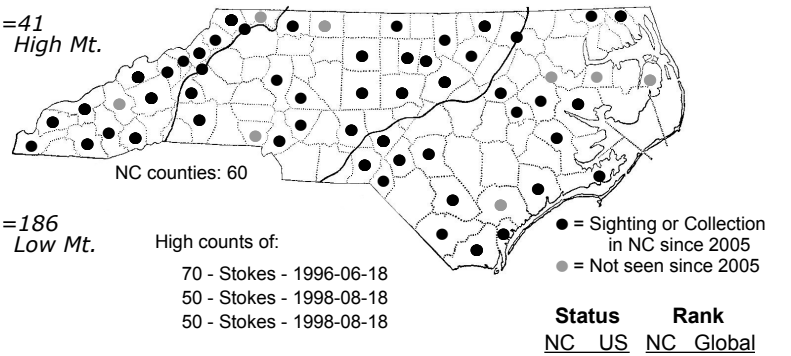
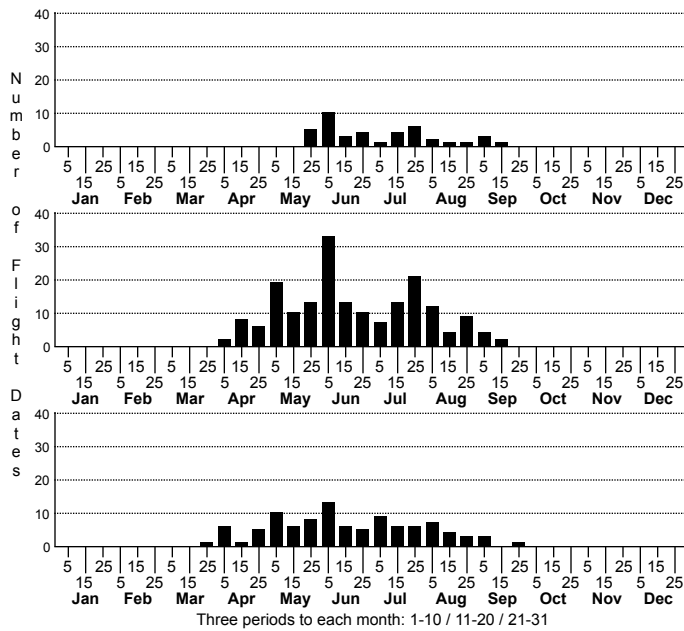


Allotria elonympha False Underwing

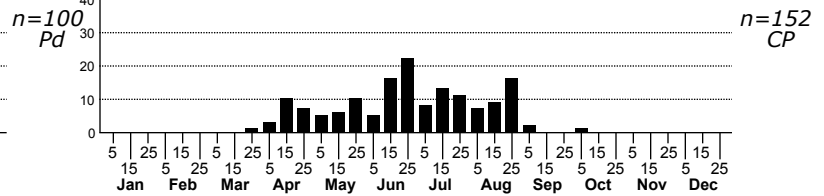

HABITAT: Found across the range of *Nyssa* species, including swamp forests and blackwater riparian forests in the Coastal Plain and dry ridges in the Piedmont and Mountains.

FOOD: Larvae feed on tupelo (*Nyssa*) species (Wagner et al., 2011). Covell (1984) also lists hickory (*Carya*) and walnut (*Juglans*). David George has documented a larva believed to be this species feeding on Blackgum (*Nyssa sylvatica*) in Durham County.
