
Gondysia smithii Smith's Darkwing

HABITAT:

FOOD: According to Wagner (pers. comm. to JBS, 2014), larvae of either $\langle i \rangle$ Gondysia smithii $\langle i \rangle$ or $\langle i \rangle$ G. telma $\langle i \rangle$ have been reared on $\langle i \rangle$ Styrax $\langle i \rangle$. Based on its association with upland forests, Bigleaf Snowbell ($\langle i \rangle$ Styrax grandifolius $\langle i \rangle$), which grows primarily in mesic hardwoods, seems like the most likely choice. Jeff Niznik has reared this species on $\langle i \rangle$ Styrax grandifolius $\langle i \rangle$ from two sites in the Piedmont.
