

DISTRIBUTION: Found statewide in North Carolina.

HABITAT: North Carolina records come from forested habitats across the state, from swamps to mountain ridges.

FOOD: Larvae feed on maples, particularly Red Maple (<i>Acer rubrum</i>); reports from other hosts are questionable (Wagner et al., 2011). In North Carolina, we have feeding records from Red Maple and Sugar Maple (<i>A. saccharum</i>).
