


Caenurgia chloropha Vetch Looper Moth

HABITAT: The vast majority of our records come from open, herbaceous habitats. It is particularly common in savannas, flatwoods, sand ridges, and maritime dunes in the Coastal Plain.

FOOD: Larvae feed on vetches (*Vicia* spp.) and other legumes (Wagner et al., 2011). In North Carolina a larva was reared on Wire Grass (*Aristida stricta*).
