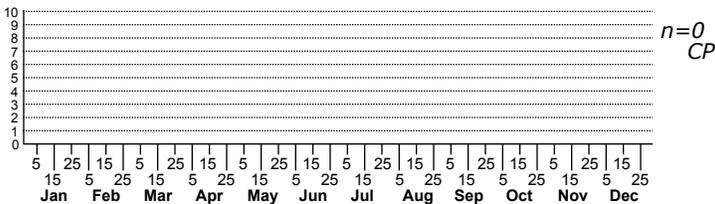




Spiloloma lunilinea Moon-lined Moth

DISTRIBUTION: Most of our records are from the Piedmont, with a couple from the Low Mountains.

HABITAT: Our records come primarily from woodland edges.

FOOD: Larvae are monophagous on Honey Locust (<i>Gleditsia triacanthos</i>) (Wagner et al., 2011), which has been confirmed as the host in North Carolina.
