

## ID COMMENTS:

DISTRIBUTION: Most common in the Coastal Plain in North Carolina, but we have records from across the state. Uncommon in the Piedmont, and apparently absent from higher elevations in the Mountains.

FLIGHT COMMENT: Please refer to the flight charts.

HABITAT: Our records come from both open and woodland habitats, as well as closed canopy, mesic forests.

FOOD: Larvae feed on sumacs (<i>Rhus</i> spp.) and <i>Toxicodendron</i>, including Poison-ivy (<i>T. radicans</i>) and Atlantic Poison-oak (<i>T. pubescens</i>) (Robinson et al., 2010). In North Carolina, our only feeding record is from Poison-ivy.
