DISTRIBUTION: Probably occurs statewide.

FLIGHT COMMENT: Please refer to the flight charts.

HABITAT: Our records come primarily from wet-mesic forests but there are also some from drier ridges and summits.

FOOD: Larvae feed on American Hornbeam (<i>Carpinus caroliniana</i>), American Hop-hornbeam (<i>Ostrya virginiana</i>), American Hazelnut (<i>Corylus americana</i>), and Beaked Hazelnut (<i>Corylus cornuta</i>) (Wagner et al., 2011). In North Carolina, Bo Sullivan reared a larva from American Hop-hornbeam.
