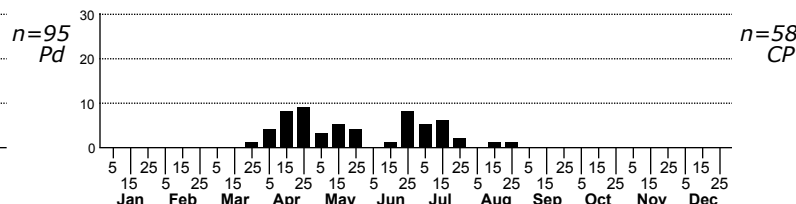
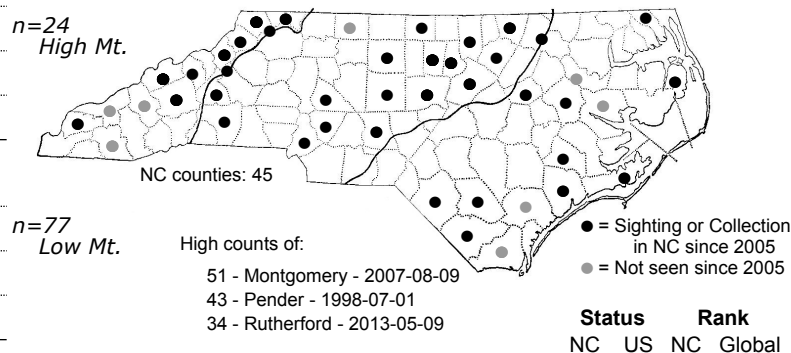
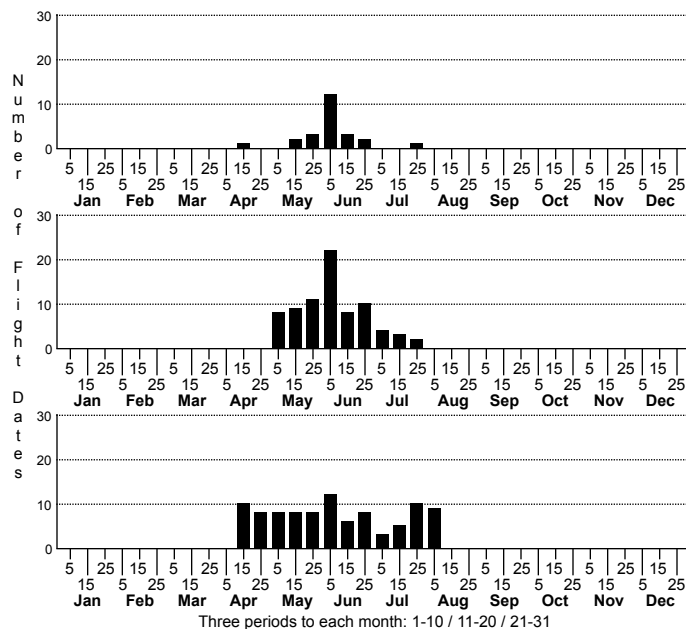

DISTRIBUTION: Probably occurs statewide

HABITAT: Our records come primarily from wet-mesic forests but there are also some from drier ridges and summits.

FOOD: Larvae feed on American Hornbeam (*Carpinus caroliniana*), American Hop-hornbeam (*Ostrya virginiana*), American Hazelnut (*Corylus americana*), and Beaked Hazelnut (*Corylus cornuta*) (Wagner et al., 2011). In North Carolina, Bo Sullivan reared a larva from American Hop-hornbeam.
