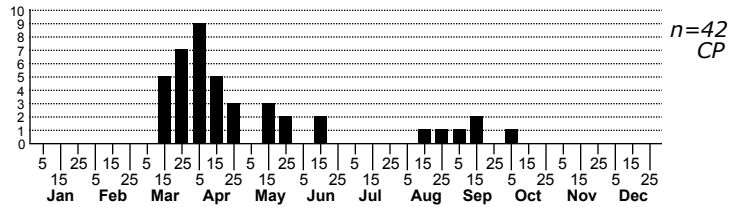
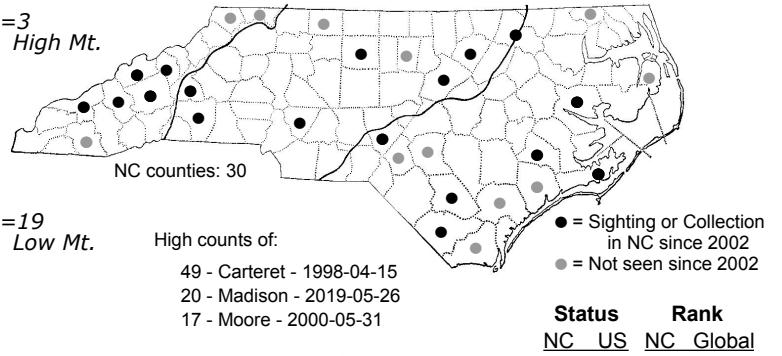
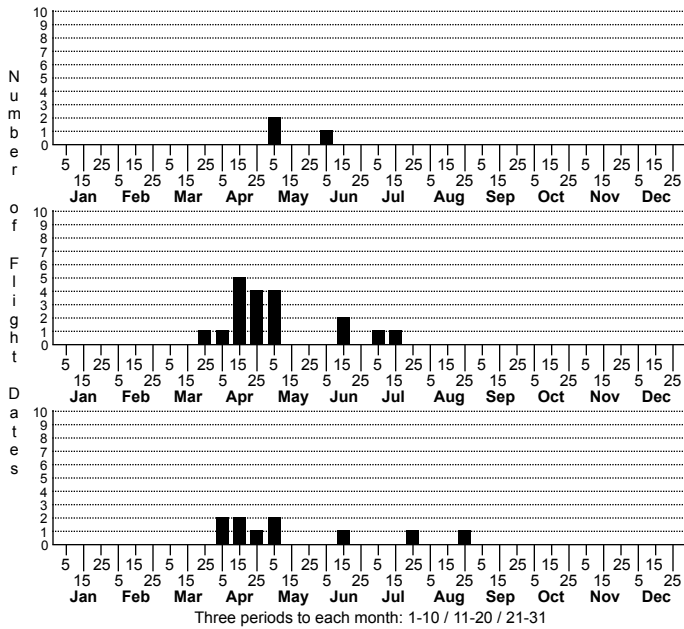


Nola triquetrana Three-spotted Nola

HABITAT: Associated with hardwood forests in the Mountains, Piedmont, and at least some sites in the Coastal Plain. A possible association with pocosin habitats needs to be investigated.

FOOD: Feeds primarily on Witch Hazel (*Hamamelis virginiana*) (Wagner et al., 2011), but Jim Petranka recently found larvae feeding on *Fothergilla major*, a member of the same family as Witch Hazel (*Hamamelidaceae*). Since at least some of our records for this species in the Coastal Plain come from savannas or pocosin ecotones, larvae should also be looked for on *Fothergilla gardenii*, a common plant along the edges of peatlands.
