




Hyperstrotia pervertens Dotted Graylet

DISTRIBUTION: Occurs statewide in North Carolina.

FOOD: Larvae have been reported from both beech (<i>Fagus</i>) and oak (<i>Quercus</i>), but beech may be favored (Wagner et al., 2011). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
