

HABITAT: We have one record from an alluvial forest in the Mountains.

FOOD: Larvae have been successfully reared in captivity on a species of upland sedge (<i>Carex</i> sp.) (J. Sogaard, BugGuide, accessed 2021-02-18). The host plants used in the wild have apparently not been documented.
