



*Leuconycta lepidula* Marbled-green Leuconycta

HABITAT: Wagner et al. (2011) list fields, wet meadows, marshes, and mesic woodlands as habitats used by this species. Our records mainly come from montane cove forests.

FOOD: Larvae have been reared on dandelion and dock in captivity (Wagner et al., 2011) but wild hosts are poorly known. There are BugGuide records for larvae feeding on Hairy-fruit Chervil (<i>Chaerophyllum tainturieri</i>) (George Smiley, 2014) and Spotted Water-hemlock (<i>Cicuta maculata</i>) (Janice Stiefel, 2006).
