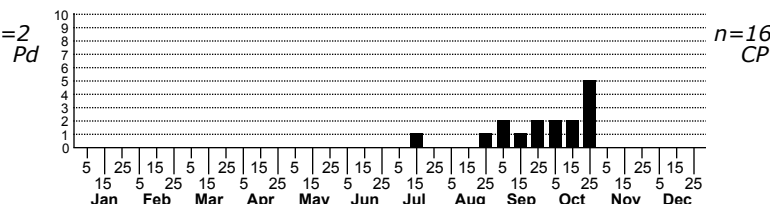
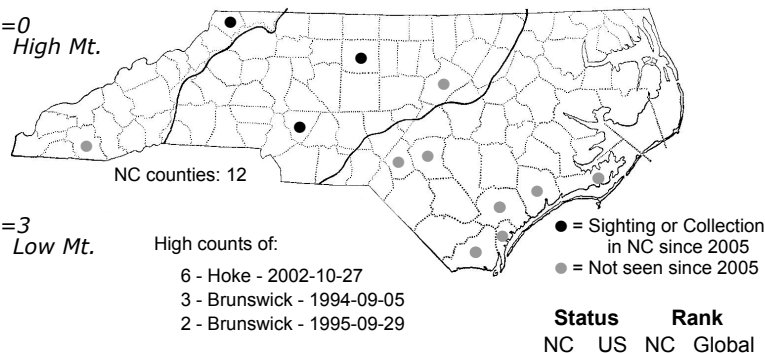
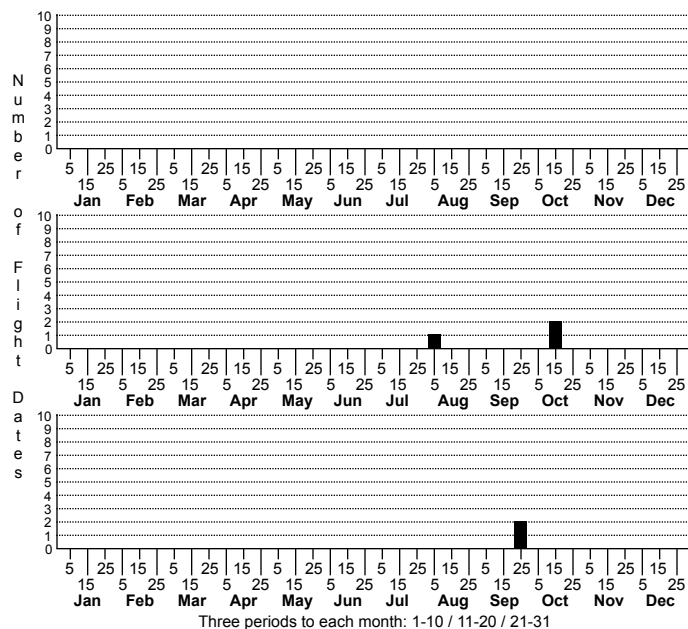


Amyna stricta Eight-spot Moth

HABITAT:

FOOD: Larvae reportedly feed on a wide range of plants, including many agriculturally important species. Robinson et al. (2010) list alfalfa, peanut, potato, soybean, and sunflower. Beadle and Leckie (2018) add *Amaranthus* and *Croton*. We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.

OBSERVATION_METHODS:

NATURAL HERITAGE PROGRAM RANKS: G5 SNR [SU]

STATE PROTECTION: Has no legal protection, although permits are required to collect it on state parks and other public lands.

COMMENTS: This species has only a few recent records in North Carolina, where it could be just a migrant rather than an established resident
