




Tarache aprica Exposed Bird-dropping Moth

HABITAT: Almost all records where this species has been found in North Carolina come from pond, lake, and river shorelines.

FOOD: Larvae feed on species of the Malvaceae, including *Hibiscus*, cultivated Hollyhock (*Alcea rosea*), and presumably other native mallows (Wagner et al., 2011).
