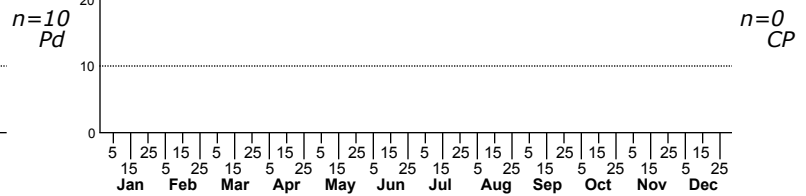
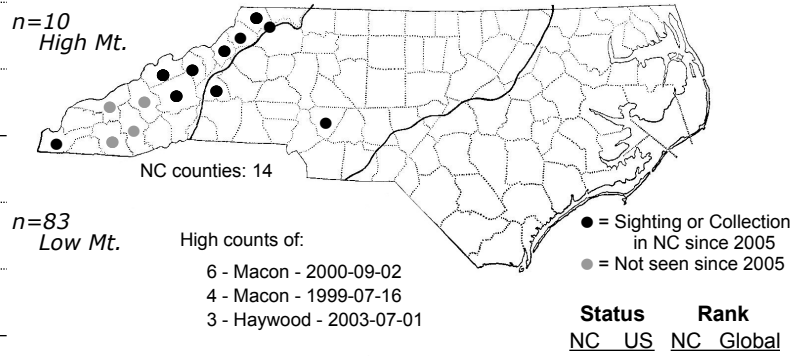
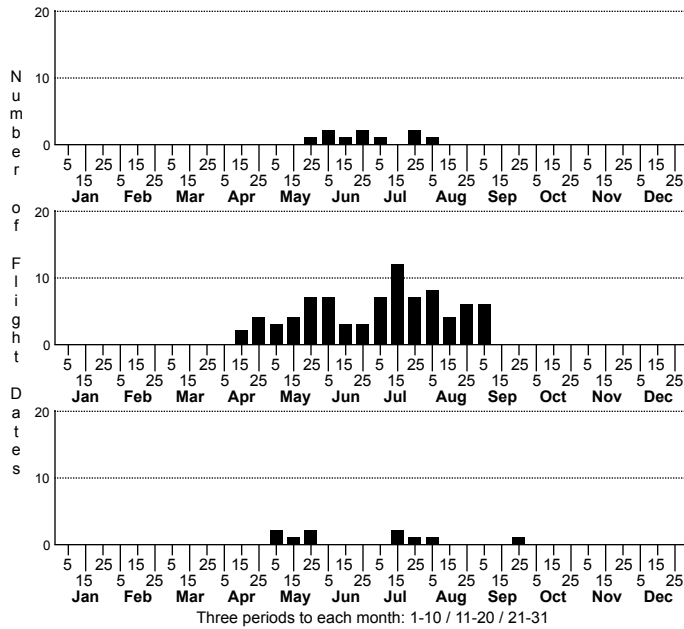


Panthea acronyctoides Black Zigzag Moth

HABITAT: Almost all of our records come from cove forests and high elevation forests. Several also come from a site at the base of the Blue Ridge escarpment where both Hemlock and White Pine are present. A single individual has been collected further west in the Piedmont but does not appear to represent a resident population.

FOOD: Larvae feed on several genera of conifers, including spruce (*Picea*), fir (*Abies*), hemlock (*Tsuga*), and pine (*Pinus*) (Wagner et al., 2011).
