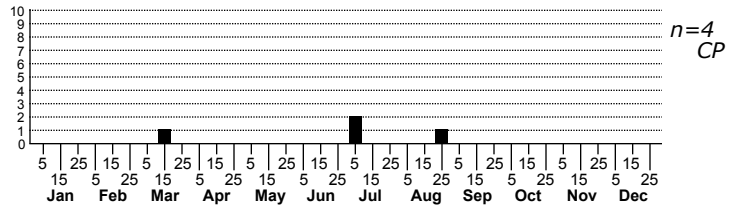
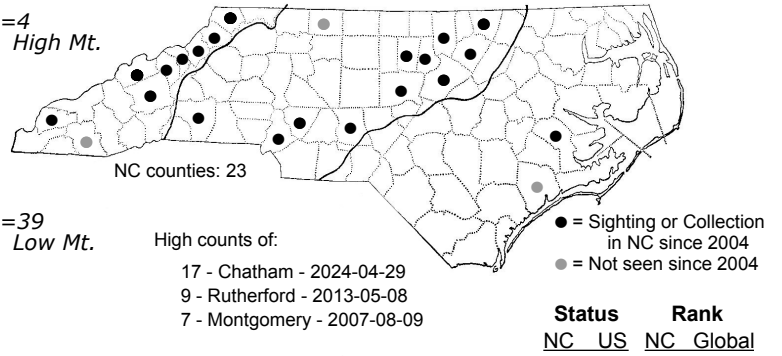
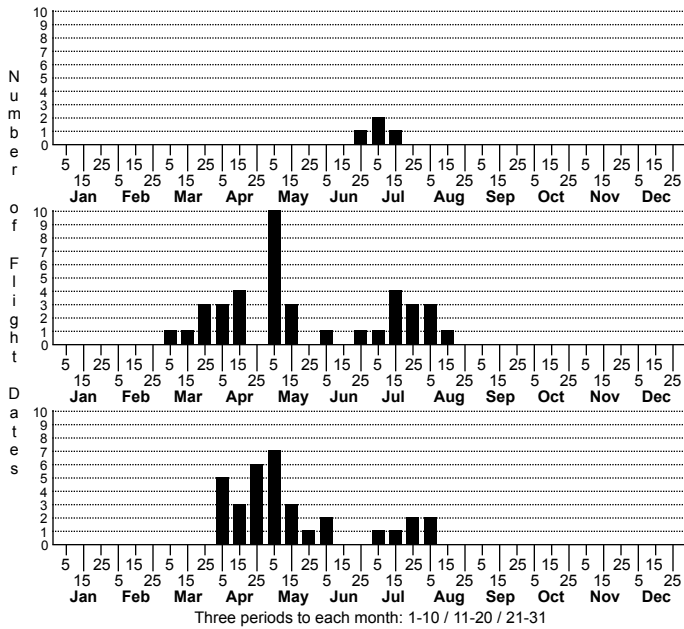


Colocasia flavicornis Saddled Yellowhorn Moth

HABITAT: Records from the Piedmont and Coastal Plain come from floodplain forests and mesic hardwood forests growing on slopes. In the Mountains, records come from alluvial forests and cove forests.

FOOD: Reported hosts include maple, birch, hickory, beech, hop-hornbeam, oak, basswood, and elm (Crumb, 1956; Heppner, 2007; Robinson et al., 2010; Beadle & Leckie, 2012).
