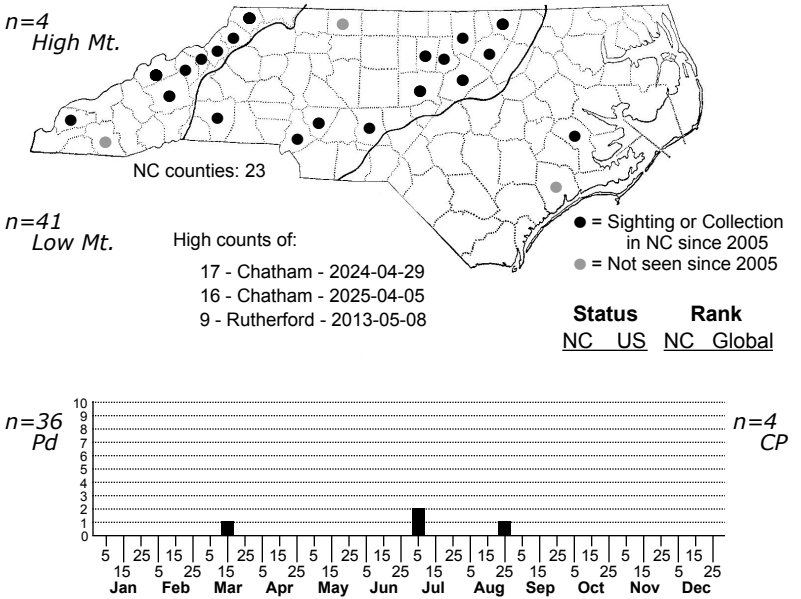
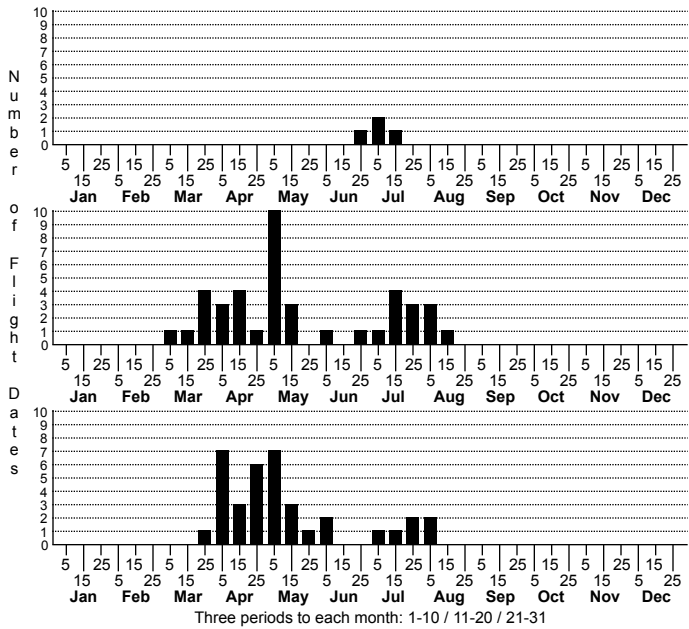


Colocasia flavicornis Saddled Yellowhorn Moth

HABITAT: Records from the Piedmont and Coastal Plain come from floodplain forests and mesic hardwood forests growing on slopes. In the Mountains, records come from alluvial forests and cove forests.

FOOD: Reported hosts include maple (<i>Acer</i>), birch (<i>Betula</i>), hickory (<i>Carya</i>), beech (<i>Fagus</i>), hop-hornbeam (<i>Ostrya</i>), oak (<i>Quercus</i>), basswood (<i>Tilia</i>), and elm (<i>Ulmus</i>) (Crumb, 1956; Heppner, 2007; Robinson et al., 2010; Beadle & Leckie, 2012). We do not have any feeding records in North Carolina.
